

Rotary Walks to End Polio

President Robin Tay of the RC Pudu, the initiator of the *Rotary Walks to End Polio* project, a fundraising cum Polio awareness walk spanning some 510km has started his journey at 6:00 am this morning from Alor Star. He was accompanied by Presidents Bhupinder and Tiffany of RC Bukit Bintang and RC Titiwangsa respectively, as well as friends of Rotary and Rotaractors from Singapore. They were flagged off by President Poe Su – and accompanied by Interactors and family members and Rotarians – of RC Alor Star.

Pres Robin Tay and the walkers were interviewed by RTM and aired over the Bahasa and Chinese news on TV1 & TV2 at 8:00 pm this evening Tuesday, 22 Dec 2009. The walk is targeted to end at 6:00 pm on Friday 8 Jan 2010 at the Grand Dorsett Hotel, Subang Jaya, where the District 3300 Annual Conference will take place.

He also joined and walked 7 km to the Iskandar bridge. The walkers' next destination is Chemor, 35 km away. Two of the original walkers were injured with blisters, and this morning one more of the Rotaractors also experienced blister pain.
